As psychiatric epidemiology continues to evolve, this Congress will also serve as a platform to mentor young researchers, disseminate cutting-edge findings, and inspire a new generation of mental health professionals committed to promoting global mental health equity. Plenary lectures, symposia, free oral presentations, and poster sessions will provide platforms for sharing findings and innovative ideas.

The 19th IFPE Congress will be held in Trento, a city located in the northeastern Italy, at the heart of the Italian Alps, between Lake Garda and the Dolomites. Trento boasts stunning Renaissance buildings adorned with frescoes, set against a breathtaking alpine backdrop, and is conveniently accessible via Verona International Airport.
